



DAVID WURM

David Wurm (born 2000 in Hamburg) is a German violinist who performs internationally both as a soloist and chamber musician. His concert engagements have taken him to renowned venues including the Berlin Philharmonie, the Elbphilharmonie, and the Laeishalle, as well as on concert tours throughout Europe and China.

Since 2014, David Wurm has performed with pianist Levi Schechtmann as a duo, presenting a wide-ranging repertoire of concert programmes. Alongside traditional recital formats, the duo also develops innovative concert concepts that transcend genre boundaries and introduce classical music to new audiences.

Since October 2024, David Wurm is the concertmaster of the Hamburg Chamber Orchestra. He is also the concertmaster and artistic director of the Albert Schweitzer Youth Orchestra, a position he has held since June 2022, where he combines artistic leadership with the mentoring of young musicians. In addition, he has served as concertmaster of the Junge Norddeutsche Philharmonie as well as the International Mendelssohn Summer School Festival Orchestra.

David Wurm began his musical education at the age of fourteen as a junior student at the Andreas Franke Academy of the Hochschule für Musik und Theater Hamburg and continued his studies there with Prof. Christoph Schickedanz until completing his Bachelor's in 2024.

For his artistic achievements, David Wurm has received numerous awards, including First Prize at the German national competition Jugend musiziert in the violin solo category. From February 2020 until October 2025, he was supported by Yehudi Menuhin Live Music Now Hamburg. He has also participated in studio and radio productions for Norddeutscher Rundfunk and Deutschlandfunk Kultur, appeared on television programmes including NDR DAS!, and contributed to CD recordings. In addition, he regularly serves as a jury member for Jugend musiziert in Hamburg.
